NOTE: To be eligible, youth must be between 15 and 30 years of age at the start of the employment; be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act and have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations.

Specific Position Duties:

- Support the planning of monthly meetings, facilitator check-in and training sessions with champions, follow up and feedback monitoring
- Support the planning, implementation and resource development of our monthly solidarity groups with NSRI women across Canada
- support the finalization of the Peer Champion Handbook. This would involve consultation with champions, supporting the development of content and layout of a new resource guide

Skills/Qualifications:

- Strong knowledge and understanding of Violence Against Women issues in immigrant and refugee communities, anti-racism and anti-oppression
- Commitment to and awareness of equity, access to service issues, anti-racism and antioppression as it relates to immigrants and refugees
- Demonstrated sensitivity to other cultures and ability to outreach to newcomer communities
- Strong written and verbal communication skills
- Detail-oriented with strong research, organizational skills and time management skills
- Able to work independently or as part of a team
- Bilingual (French) is an asset
