

WHAT IS CURRENTLY HAPPENING?

Sponsors

- Responsible for financial, social, and emotional support of sponsored refugees.
- Not always aware of settlement services (only 67% of PSRs say their sponsors were able to support their settlement needs).

Sponsored Refugees

- Desire access to more equitable. and client-centred settlement services.
- Agree settlement services are important but are not always aware of the services available to them.

Settlement Workers

- Provide settlement expertise and a supportive role to sponsored refugees (77% of PSRs agreed that accessing settlement services was very helpful).
- Not funded to work with sponsors and limited in outreach to sponsored refugees.

HOW CAN WE **WORK BETTER TOGETHER?**



Find common ground

Concentrate on what would best support PSRs



Clarify roles and responsibilities

51% of all stakeholders identified role confusion as the top challenge



Build positive relationships

And leverage existing links



Address barriers to collaboration

Including lack of training, and staff/ volunteer capacity
