- Coordinate program teams and advisory groups to recommend project development and implementation
- Plan, facilitate and conduct meetings
- Coordinate the publicity and development of news releases, graphics, brochures, pamphlets and other material
- Manage the GBV Community of Practice website to support networking and collaboration within communities
- Prepare narrative and evaluative reports on project(s) progress

Who we are:

Required qualifications:

- Relevant post-secondary diploma or degree (e.g. social science, social work, community development, immigration & settlement studies) or the equivalent acceptable combination of education and experience working in the non-profit sector with a focus on organizational development and change, capacity building and training
- Minimum 3 years of experience in a similar role as a coordinator working in a non-profit or community-based agency in areas of gender-based violence or women's services organization
- Extensive experience in developing and facilitating trainings and workshops on gender-based violence
- Extensive knowledge of GBV issues, survivor-led projects and challenges in the newcomer and refugee communities in Canada
- Ability to work with newcomer communities and NSRI women and survivors in a trauma-informed, de-colonial and respectful manner
- Strong analysis of power, privilege and positionality and how to ensure that oppressive power dynamics are not replicated through the program activities
- Demonstrated commitment to principles of social justice, cultural competency and equity and inclusion
- Demonstrated experience in program coordination including program planning, developing work plans, priority settings, keeping track of expenses, writing reports to funders and evaluation
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills including the ability to communicate effectively with a wide range of stakeholders and influence decision-makers
- Strong relationship building and networking skills as well as the ability to establish rapport with members, partners, staff, students and volunteers
- Excellent interpersonal skills including the ability to consult and collaborate
- Good computer skills, proficient with MS Office applications
- Demonstrated experience utilizing social media tools to promote projects/campaigns
- Ability to function in a multidisciplinary, culturally diverse workplace and work with a wide range of client groups
- Strong research, analytical and editorial skills
- Detailed-oriented with strong organizational skills to meet tight deadlines and demanding schedules
- Good judgement, problem solving and conflict resolution skills
- Ability to work both independently and as part of a team environment
